We are doing well – not great, but well. The Number One Issue right now is that we do not have a title sponsor. If you have a contact with any business, neighbor, etc., we need a title sponsor. We're looking for either one title sponsor to the tune of \$10,000 or two that we can split at \$5,000/each. The check will be written directly to the foundation. Then it will be a tax write off; this is not uncommon for larger businesses to write this kind of check. If we don't get a title sponsor within the next couple of weeks, then we're going to stop

worrying about a title sponsor this year and start working on a title sponsor for next year right now. Businesses do this on a very regular basis. Their name goes on every single flier that we put out (at least 400), we printed 1500 tri-folds, we'll have a minimum of little gift certificates, every little zipper bag of golf balls will have the title sponsor name on it. They'll have prominent placement at the golf tournament itself and they get a free foursome. We need a title sponsor, as that will be a major chunk of our charity budget for next year.

Places that have already been or are being approached: Cox Cable, Oceans 11, Waste Management, Jack-in-the-Box Corporate, Hootwinc Foundation (Hooters), Dick's Sporting Goods and Petco. In an effort to avoid having one business solicited by more than one club member, each team has been assigned an area to work. Check with Bob Williamson as he has the master list.

Scott commented that he cannot emphasize enough how important this event is as it will be our charity budget for next year. Five years ago we had a Charity Budget of \$25,000; last year we had a Charity Budget of \$15,000.

The bottom line is that we haven't been doing as well raising money and this is an awesome way to do so.

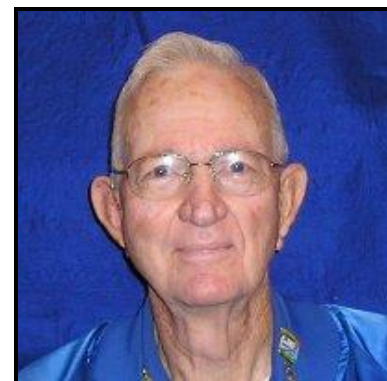
